The objects of the Foundation are to:

a) Promote sustainable development and, in particular, the integration of the social dimension with environmental and economic planning. Work with stakeholders, governments, intergovernmental bodies and individuals to fulfil this objective;

b) Engage in global, national or local activities to protect the environment and promote biodiversity, through sustainable farming, wildlife protection and ecological awareness raising;

c) Promote the social ownership of property and resources as important to economic development;

d) Promote the development of life-supporting cooperative communities as a means of attaining these

objects, including through collective housing or group care facilities for children, seniors or others;

e) Engage in or promote research, training and education through the development of materials, programmes or facilities;

f) Promote the use of live music and live performances as a means of celebration and education for sustainable development.

g) Promote personal well-being, health and equality (especially gender equality) in organizing for change, through spiritual harmony, the arts, the use of ritual, and the growth of world peace;

h) Recognize and promote the rights of Indigenous and tribal peoples to self-determination and engage in

reconciliation efforts to recognize and implement such rights;

i) Promote the fundamental rights of workers and trade unions and promote ILO Instruments and

measures to defend such rights and encourage cooperation among international and inter-governmental bodies for this purpose;

j) Promote the engagement of workers, employers and trade unions in health, safety and environment issues, through sustainable development, workplace and political actions;

k) Advocate for corporate accountability measures through public, worker and trade union involvement;

l) Affiliate with other individuals and groups having similar interests;

m) Collect money by way of donations or otherwise, and to accept gifts, legacies, devises and bequests, and to hold, invest, expend or deal with the same in furtherance of the objects of the Association; and

n) Promote the above objects as integrated and connected to each other.
